- Maintaining relevant polices procedures, systems, information, training, recognition programs, and organisational structures to suppot and communicate effective health and safety practices
- Utilising appropriate internal and /or external expertise when required in all activities
- Effective disseminate health and safety information to all employees and contractors etc.
- Maintaining a positive safety culture through encouraging active participation, consultation, and cooperation of employees, contractors, participants, volunteers, and board, in promoting and developing measures to improve health and safety at work
- Actively responding to/and investigation all incidents
